**THE WEST BENGAL UNIVERSITY LAWS
AMENDMENT (No. 2) ACT, 1976.**

[*Passed by the West Bengal Legislature.*]

An Act to provide for the compulsory retirement of Vice-Chancellors on attaining the age of sixty-five years.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the compulsory retirement of Vice-Chancellors on attaining the age of sixty-five years;

It is hereby enacted in the Twenty-seventh Year of the Republic of India, by the Legislature of West Bengal, as follows:—

1. This Act may be called the West Bengal University Laws Short title. Amendment (No. 2) Act, 1976.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, "University" Definition. means any of the Universities constituted or established, as the case may be, under sub-section (1) of section 3 of—

(i) the Calcutta University Act, 1966;

(ii) the North Bengal University Act, 1961;

(iii) the Kalyani University Act, 1960;

(iv) the Burdwan University Act, 1959;

(v) the Jadavpur University Act, 1955; and

(vi) the Rabindra Bharati Act, 1961.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in any law for the time being in force, no person shall hold office as a Vice-Chancellor of a University after he has attained the age of sixty-five years:

Provided that nothing contained in this section shall apply to a Vice-Chancellor who was appointed before the coming into force of this Act.

Explanation.—For the purposes of this section, a Vice-Chancellor includes a Pro-Vice-Chancellor.
